Expedited Partner Therapy

Expedited Partner Therapy (EPT) is the clinical practice of treating the sex partners of persons with Chlamydia or Gonorrhea, by providing medicines or prescriptions to the patient.

EPT can be offered to heterosexual patients when the provider cannot confidently ensure that all of the patient's sex partners from the prior 60 days will be treated.

Legal Authority

Michigan's Communicable Disease rules are propagated under authority conferred by Michigan Implied law 333.5111. Violations of these laws are reported to the State of Michigan.

Health professionals are advised to consult with the Health Department or legal counsel if they have questions about their responsibilities under these rules.

The Privacy Rule of HIPPA allows for the disclosure of protected health information, without patient consent or authorization, to public health officials who are legally authorized to receive such reports for the purpose of preventing or controlling disease.
