









Cannabis use and risks of respiratory and all-cause morbidity and mortality

- Cannabis-involved Emergency Department (ED) visits among young persons were higher during the COVID-19 pandemic than during 2019.
- Increases in cannabis-involved ED visit rates occurred among children aged ≤10 years, and among persons aged 11–14 years.
 - Rates among females aged 11–14 years increased more than they did among males.


<u>Cannabis-Involved Emergency Department Visits Among Persons Aged <25</u> <u>Years Before and During the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

• Cannabis users had significantly greater odds (22%) of an emergency room visit or hospital admission for any cause.




- In Eaton County, 25.2% of adults aged 18-34 reported using marijuana at least once in the past 30 days.
- 7.3% of Eaton County adults aged 35-54 reported everyday use of marijuana.

Michigan: Youth Marijuana Use




• The percent of high school students in Michigan reporting currently using marijuana decreased from 24% in 2017 to 14% in 2021.


25% of Michigan High school students reported ever using marijuana
