c. Standing Reports	i. Environmental Health  Shane Adams and Allyson Diebel presented a comprehensive report on the Harmful Algae Bloom (HAB) detected at  Thornapple Lake on August 4, 2025. Their presentation covered the detection protocol, water quality testing procedures, and public notification timeline. They provided an educational overview of HAB development cycles, associated health risks including potential neurological and gastrointestinal impacts,

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	and issued public safety recommendations including water use
	restrictions. The presentation prompted discussion among
	commissioners.
	ii. Planning, Promotion and Evaluation
	Milea presented the quarterly strategic plan progress report,
	highlighting mixed results across planned initiatives. While
	several key activities have advanced according to schedule,
	multiple projects were discontinued due to recent staffing
	reductions. Milea committed to distributing a detailed written
	update via email to provide specific metrics and revised
	timelines for remaining initiatives.
	iii. Personal and Community Health
	a. Jill delivered an educational presentation on animal bite
	protocols and rabies prevention. She outlined infection
	risks associated with various bite scenarios, identified
	the primary rabies vectors in the region (including bats,
	raccoons, and unvaccinated domestic animals), and
	provided step-by-step exposure response procedures.
	b. Bea presented the annual hearing and vision screening
	program report, detailing service statistics and
	outcomes from the past year. Colette formally
	recognized Bea's exceptional dedication in single-
	handedly managing the entire program since January
	following staff departures. The presentation also
	addressed proposed state budget modifications that
	would alter funding allocations for the program,
	potentially impacting service delivery.
d. Health Officer Report	a. Colette presented an analysis of Environmental Health (EH)
	fees as a potential revenue stream and recommended that
	the Board conduct a comprehensive fee structure review

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		during FY26 to establish formal policies governing fee
		determination and adjustments.
	b.	Colette presented the revised FY26 budget proposal, which
		incorporates a 50% reduction in local government
		appropriations offset by a corresponding 50% increase in
		Environmental Health fees. The budget proposal sparked
		extensive Board deliberation regarding the appropriateness
		and necessity of such a substantial fee increase.
		Commissioners questioned whether additional operational
		cuts could be implemented as an alternative to the proposed
		fee structure changes. Following thorough discussion of
		budget reductions already implemented and potential
		alternatives, the Board declined to approve the budget and
		requested additional time for detailed analysis. Final budget
		action is scheduled for the regular September meeting.
	c.	Colette provided educational content on the department's
		organizational structure and minimum staffing requirements
		necessary to maintain essential public health service
		delivery.
