# BEDHD Hybrid Immunization Waivers

October 17, 2025

### Program Overview



What We Changed:

Implemented hybrid model for immunization waiver process



Education component: Moved online (self-paced)



Form signing:
Scheduled on
dedicated
appointment days



Goal: Streamline process and reduce staff time burden

# The Problem We Were Solving

#### Previous Process Challenges:

- Each waiver required a 30-minute appointment w/ staff
- Staff time dedicated to scheduling, education and form completion
- Scheduling bottlenecks during peak periods
- Limited appointment availability

# Program Adoption & Volume

#### 2024-2025 Waiver Activity:

- **532** 2024 Total Waivers (Old Format)
- **544** 2025 Total Waivers (Year-to-Date)
- 279 completed through new hybrid program which rolled out August 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025
- 51% of all waivers in so far 2025

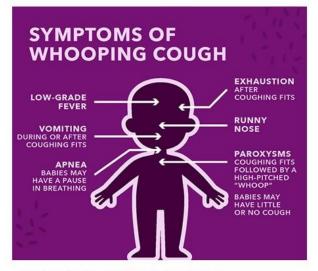

# Education Slide Examples

#### **WHOOPING COUGH (PERTUSSIS)**

Also known as Pertussis, it is a highly contagious disease that can be deadly for babies. It gets its name from the *Bordetella pertussis* bacteria that cause the disease and its characteristic "whooping" cough (the "whoop" sound of someone gasping for air after a coughing spell).





Pertussis symptoms can continue for up to 12 weeks



# Education Slide Examples

#### **POLIO**

- Polio, or Poliomyelitis, is a disabling and lifethreatening disease caused by the poliovirus.
- The virus is very contagious and spreads easily from person to person. It can infect a person's spinal cord, causing paralysis (can't move parts of the body).



#### **Facts About Polio**

- A person can spread Polio to others immediately before and up to 2 weeks after symptoms start. Even those who don't have symptoms can pass it on to others.
- Symptoms of Polio include:
  - Sore Throat
  - Fever
  - Headache
  - Stomach pain or nausea
  - Paralysis
  - Feeling pins and needles in the legs
  - Weakness in the arms and legs
  - Meningitis (infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord)
- Polio can cause death.



## Time Savings Analysis



#### **Staff Time Recovered:**

**139.5 hours** Traditional Model (279 × 30 min)

**70-90 hours** Time Saved (15-20 min per waiver)



Equivalent to 2-2.5 weeks of full-time staff capacity redirected to other services

### Key Benefits Realized

#### **For Families:**

- Complete education at their own pace
- Dedicated days to sign documents
- Reduced wait times

#### For Staff:

- More efficient use of time
- Increased capacity for other services
- Easier process for staff

# Next Steps & Recommendations

#### **Moving Forward:**

- Continue hybrid model as standard practice
- Monitor completion rates and satisfaction
- Alter content and length of education as needed (Currently ~30-40m to complete)

#### **Key Takeaways:**

- ✓ Successfully launched in August 2025
- ✓ 51% of all waivers this year have been done with the new format
- √ Saved 70-90 staff hours to date (so far!)
- ✓ Improved efficiency without compromising education
