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i. Milea Burgstahler provided a staffing update for the Environmental Health Division. The department is recruiting for three Environmental Health Specialist positions following recent staff resignations due to employees accepting positions at EGLE and Ingham County. Milea outlines strategies to maintain continuity of services during this staffing shortage, including coordination with other health departments to support inspection activities and consultation with MDARD and EGLE. Discussion followed and questions from the board were addressed.

c. Personal & Community Health

i. Laurel McCamman, Maternal Child Health Supervisor, presented an overview of the WIC program in Michigan. She reported that the Barry-Eaton WIC program serves approximately 2,000 clients per month, the majority of whom are children ages 1–5, with infants representing about 20% of the caseload. Laurel reviewed current food benefit levels, noting that children ages 1–5 receive \$26 per month, while pregnant women receive approximately \$47–52 per month. In 2024, WIC funding resulted in approximately \$1.6 million in food expenditures by Barry-Eaton clients.

Courtney Madalinski, WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselor, provided an overview of the Peer Counselor role and shared several examples of client impact. She assisted an 18-year-old first-time mother with limited family support who successfully breastfed for over a year, and also supported a working mother who, after job loss and enrollment in Medicaid and WIC, regularly attended the Baby Café and breastfed for more than a year. Additionally, Courtney described her work with a mother experiencing transportation barriers and no family support, conducting weekly virtual visits to provide breastfeeding

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	guidance and assisting her with enrollment in Medicaid and WIC. Commissioners expressed appreciation to Courtney for her dedication and support to mothers in the community.

AVIAN INFLUENZA

- H5N5 Washington State first human infection
 - https://doh.wa.gov/newsroom/h5n5-avian-influenza-confirmed-graysharbor-county-resident
 - passed away 11/21 older adult with pre-existing conditions who had backyard domestic birds.
 - Virus: H5N5 first known case in humans
 - Suspected there is no increased risk of bird flu- Most exposures to H5 viruses is still going to be H5N1
 - No signs of transmission between people.
 - People who keep backyard flocks, should keep their birds separated from wild birds and use proper protective gear.
