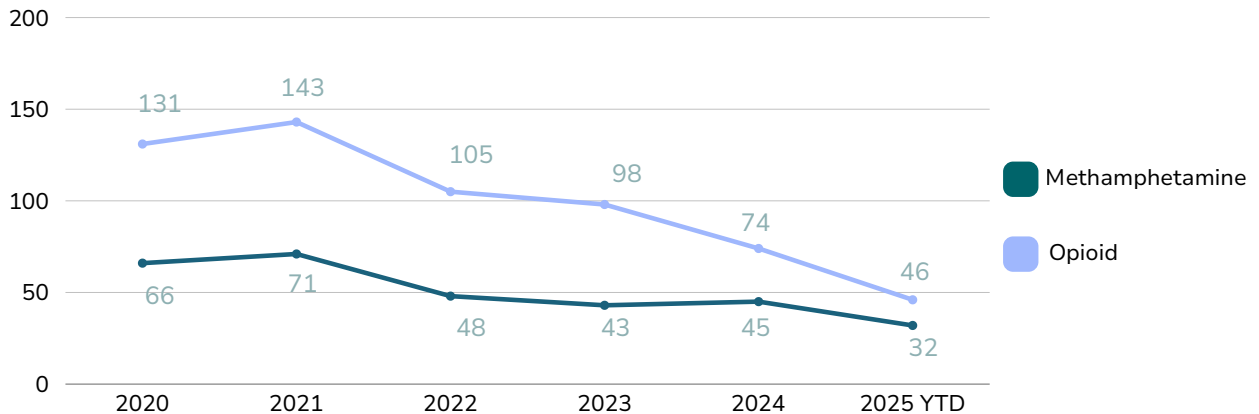

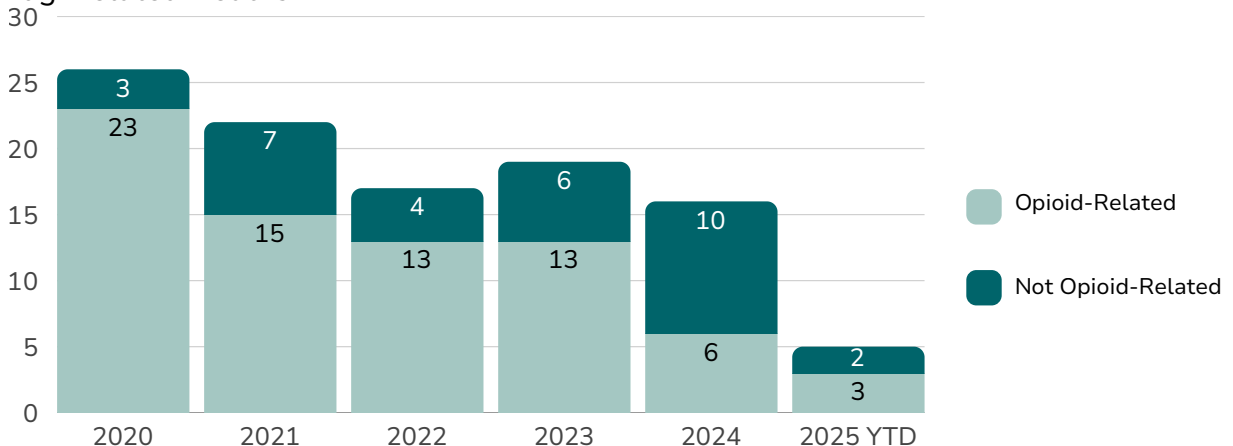

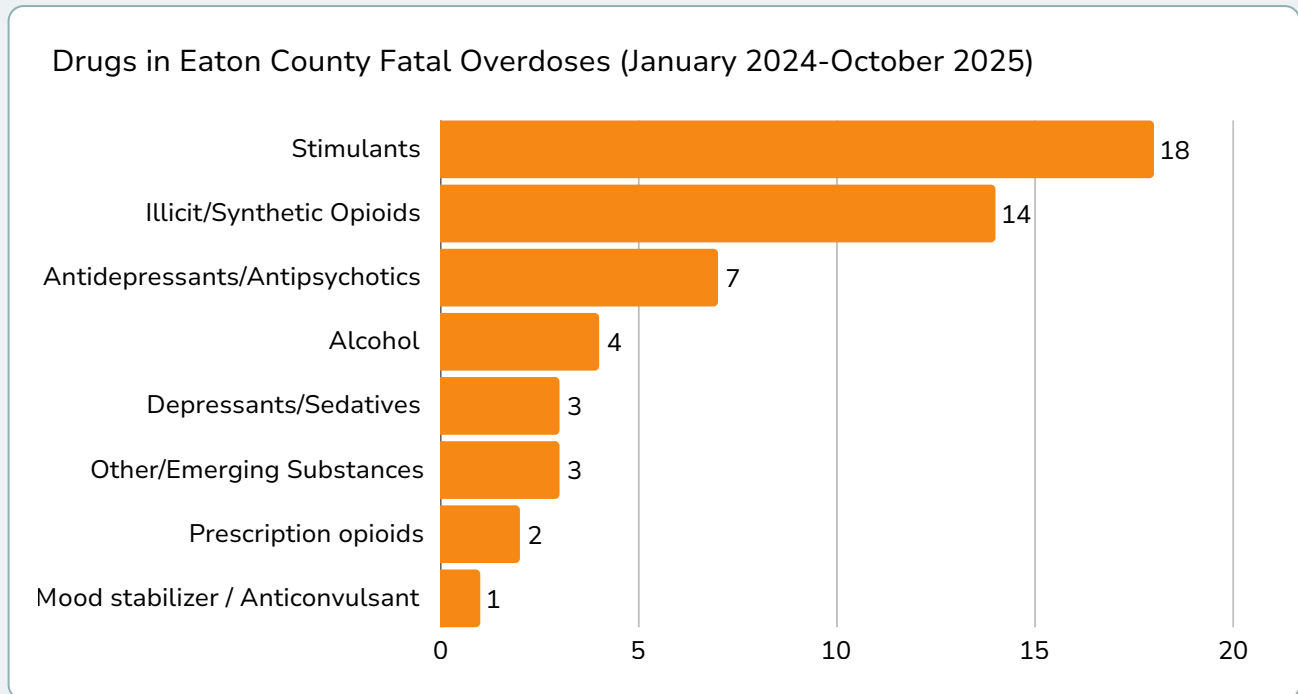


Drug-Related Deaths



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These drug trends and counts are based on deaths in Eaton County from 2024 through year-to-date 2025 (n = 21). Of these, 67% involved polysubstance use, indicating that the majority of deaths were associated with more than one drug



Note: A single death may involve multiple drugs. Counts represent the number of times a substance was detected among fatal overdoses, not distinct cases.

Drug Category	Drugs
Illicit/Synthetic Opioids	Fentanyl, Fluorofentanyl, Acetylfentanyl, Carfentanil
Stimulants	Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Amphetamine
Depressants/Sedatives	Bromazolam, Lorazepam, Alprazolam
Alcohol	Ethanol
Antidepressants/Antipsychotics	Quetiapine, Mirtazapine, trazadone, venlafaxine, aripiprazole, Doxepin, Fluoxetine
Other/Emerging Substances	Xylazine, Mitragynine, Diphenhydramine
Prescription opioids	Methodone- unknown if prescribed
Mood stabilizer / Anticonvulsant	Lamotrigine
